'Ball of Fire'

In this commercial we hear a ball served at 234kmph. Captured with a nano microphone, we can hear every piece of the action.

SFX: Soaring sound of a ball cutting through the air

VO: The Australian Open is fascinating...

Courtesy of a nano microphone, this is the sound of a tennis ball served at a superhuman 234 kilometres per hour.

With top spin, it's hurtling towards the opponent like a burning meteorite through space.

SFX: We now transition from the sound up close to the sound as we'd normally hear it for a brief moment, and the ball bounces on the court – it's an ace.

SFX: The crowd goes wild!

Title: Get Closer to the Action: 'Slide'

'Slide'

In this commercial we hear a tennis player's foot slide across the court. Captured with a nano microphone, we can hear every piece of the action.

SFX: Screeching of a tennis shoe across the court

VO: The Australian Open is fascinating...

Captured by a nano microphone, this is the sound of a tennis player's foot, sliding across the hard court.

Slowing at a rate of 120kmph, the ankle withstands twice the athlete's weight...

The friction is almost enough to start a fire.

SFX: We now transition from the sound up close to the sound as we'd normally hear it for a brief moment – we hear the distinctive squeaking of a sneaker on the court as the player lunges to hit a volley.

SFX: The crowd goes wild!

Title: Get Closer to the Action: 'Strings'

'Strings'

In this commercial we hear a racquet travelling through the air, then the strings reacting as the ball is hit. Captured with a nano microphone, we can hear every action.

SFX: Racquet head travelling through the air

VO: The Australian Open is fascinating...

This is the sound of tennis racquet strings recorded with a nano microphone.

The ball makes contact with the strings for 5 milliseconds.

String fibres grip the ball like muscular tentacles, generating spin and rebounding with vigorous vibrations.

SFX: We hear the Whup! Whup! Whup! of the strings recoiling as the ball leaves the racquet.

SFX: We now transition from the sound of the racquet strings recoiling to the distinctive sound of a ball hitting the court – it's in!

SFX: The crowd goes wild!
